

Honors College Advisement Resources

The UNM Honors College provides rewarding opportunities for intensive, interdisciplinary and cross-cultural, liberal-arts education to motivated, talented, and creative undergraduates in all majors and to build a community of scholars. All students at UNM, regardless of their major, are encouraged to apply to the Honors College and pursue a credential option to enhance their UNM experience. Students need to be admitted to the Honors College prior to registering for any Honors College courses.

Important information

- Benefits of the Honors College
 - A/CR/NC Grading System. Students can leverage this to their benefit to improve their semester and/or cumulative GPA.
 - If a student retains active status in the Honors College (i.e. taking at least two HNRS/UHON courses in first year, and then one HNRS/UHON course per academic year and maintaining a 3.2 GPA), they receive the benefit of priority registration.
 - No exams!

Admissions

- The Honors College experience can be started at any time. We encourage current UNM students and transfer students to apply.
- Admissions are processed on a rolling basis, typically at the beginning of each month. Contact honorsadvisors@unm.edu for any questions about admissions.

Registration

- All recently admitted Honors College students receive an override to register for HNRS 1120 from Honors College advisors (if they place out of FYEX 1030 Critical Text Analysis). Admitted students with 30+ credit hours of prior college coursework can start their experience out of sequence (e.g. they can register for upper-division coursework). We encourage students with 30+ credit hours (CH) of prior college coursework to schedule an advisement appointment to discuss different Honors courses.
- Lower-division courses have the prefix of HNRS and upper-division courses have the prefix of UHON.
- Honors College advisors provide overrides for HRNS/UHON courses. Advisors and/or students should contact Honors advisors if they believe any overrides are necessary.

Multiple credential options

- The most popular Honors credential option is the Certificate in Honors Interdisciplinary Liberal Arts (15 CH), 6 CH of which can be pre-approved Honors College coursework from other departments. We also offer a BA degree (36 CH), UNM Honors Scholar Distinction (27 CH), and Minor (21 CH).
 - The Distinction can double-dip with a student's major(s)/minor(s) for up to 12 CH. The Certificate can double-dip with a student's major(s)/minor(s) for up to 6 CH.
- The Certificate in Interdisciplinary Design (12 CH) does not require Honors College admission.

What is Seminar-style Learning?

All Honors College courses are capped at 18 students each to promote seminar-style learning. This type of small classroom structure is designed to create community and belonging and helps promote leadership among students. Through in-class discussions and course assignments, students develop their communication and critical thinking skills by engaging in critical dialogue, analyzing information, and exercising their creativity.
