About Honors

Bringing together students from all majors, the UNM Honors College offers small, discussion-based courses taught by research faculty whose home is in honors. All of our classes are interdisciplinary, which means they combine materials from different fields (like fine arts, paleontology, literature and criminal justice); by connecting ideas across disciplines, including your major, you will learn how to approach complex problems from many perspectives. We want to help students develop their creative and critical thinking skills to address the big challenges and questions of the 21st century, whether globally or right here in New Mexico. Honors provides opportunities for research, internships, and study abroad; we also offer extracurricular activities, too, where you can have fun and make friends. And, because most honors courses satisfy general education requirements, participation in honors may not add extra credits to your degree.

In the Honors College, students experience a supportive, encouraging environment where they can express themselves freely and explore a wide range of disciplines. Dedicated faculty and staff, work alongside students throughout their college journey and join in celebrating student achievements. We provide diverse spaces to learn without limitations, create community, explore creativity, and bring a lively curiosity to bear on big questions about the world.
